In 2021, the [Florida State Legislature](#) is scheduled to convene on March 2, 2021, and adjourn on April 30, 2021.

The legislators serving in this session took office following the [2020 elections](#). Republicans won a 24-16 majority in the [Senate](#) and a 78-42 majority in the [House](#). The party also controlled the governorship, creating a Republican [state government trifecta](#). At the start of the 2021 session, Florida is one of 28 state legislatures where neither party had a [veto-proof supermajority](#) in both chambers.

The Florida State Legislature is responsible for [redistricting](#) following each census. Legislators are expected to address redistricting as part of the 2021 legislative session. As of the 2020 Census, Florida was one of 37 states where legislators were responsible for redistricting.

At the beginning of the 2021 legislative session:

- Republicans held a majority in the Florida state House and state Senate.
- Florida was one of 22 Republican [state government trifectas](#).
- Florida's governor was Republican [Ron DeSantis](#).

Partisan control in 2021

Florida was one of 22 Republican [state government trifectas](#) at the start of 2020 legislative sessions. A state government trifecta occurs when one political party holds the governor's office, a majority in the state Senate, and a majority in the state House.

Florida is also one of 28 state legislatures where neither party has a [veto-proof supermajority](#) in both chambers. Veto overrides occur when a legislature votes to reverse a veto issued by an executive such as a governor or the president. If one party has a majority in a state legislature that is large

enough to override a gubernatorial veto without any votes from members of the minority party, it is called a **veto-proof majority** or, sometimes, a **supermajority**. To read more about veto-proof supermajorities in state legislatures, [click here](#).
